- Submissions have to be in English.
- Submissions should not have been published in any way before; however, we accept up to 35% pre-published content in the final book as long as the rights are with the author.
- Submissions should not be under review elsewhere.
- Submissions should meet the scope and goals of the series. Works with an applied focus on global issues, works within philosophy of disability, trans* philosophy, feminist philosophy, critical race studies, environmental justice, indigenous philosophy, Critical Theory, non-ideal theory, and ecofeminism (to name but a few) are particularly welcome.
